OUR COLLECTIVE GOAL



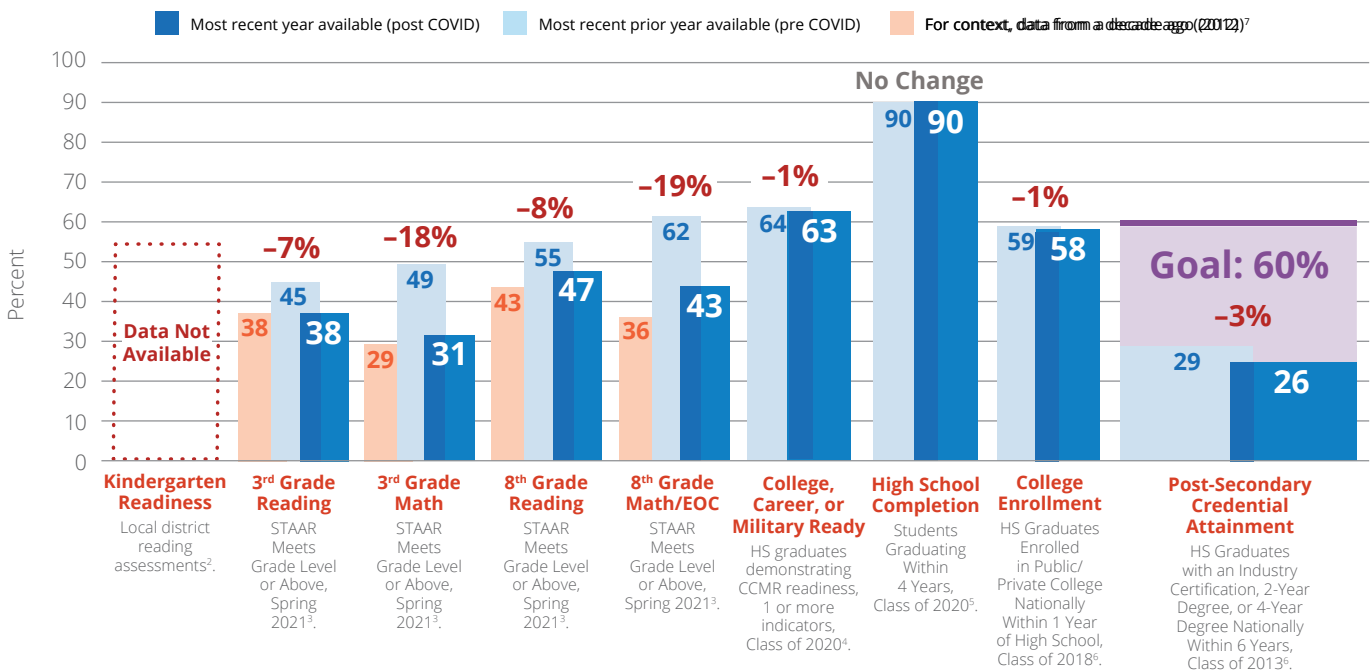
By 2030, 60% of Texans ages 25–64 will have a degree, certificate, or other high-value postsecondary credential.

By 2030, most jobs will require some training beyond high school (a four-year degree, a two-year associate degree, or some type of industry credential)¹. YEAR-OVER-YEAR STUDENT OUTCOMES



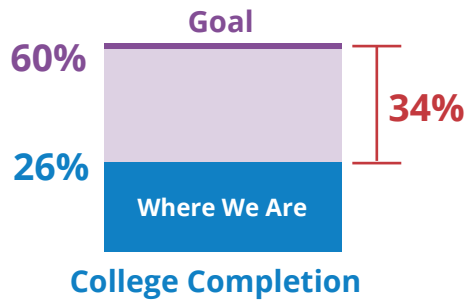
